



LABOUR FORCE SURVEY 2018 MAIN RESULTS

- In 2018 the number of **economically active population aged 15 64** was 3 239.6 thousand and represented 71.5% of population in the same age group.
- The **total number of employed persons** was 3 152.7 thousand, representing 52.4% of population aged 15 and over. Of them 1 685.3 thousand (53.5%) were men and 1 467.3 thousand (46.5%) were women.
- There were 3 068.9 thousand **employed persons aged 15 64**. The **employment rate for the same age group** was 67.7% (71.5% for men and 63.9% for women).
- The employment rate for the age group 20 64 years was 72.4%, by 1.1 percentage points higher compared to 2017. The employment rate (20 64 years) increased by 1.2 percentage points for men and by 1.0 percentage point for women, achieving 76.5% and 68.3% respectively.




Figure 1. Employment rates by age group

- The employment rate for people aged 55 64 achieved 60.7% (65.4% for men and 56.4% for women). In comparison with 2017 it increased by 2.5 percentage points (by 2.9 percentage points for men and by 2.1 percentage points for women).
- There were 173.3 thousand **unemployed persons**, of whom 101.7 thousand men and 71.6 thousand women. From 2017 the number of unemployed persons has declined by 16.2%.
- The unemployment rate went down by 1.0 percentage point in comparison with 2017 and stood at 5.2%. Over the same period the unemployment rate decreased by 0.7 percentage





points for men and by 1.2 percentage points for women, achieving 5.7% and 4.7% respectively.




Figure 2. Unemployment rates by sex

- The unemployment rate for the age group 15 29 years was 8.3%. Compared to 2017 the unemployment rates for this age group declined by 1.6 percentage points.
- The number of **long-term unemployed persons** was 101.6 thousand, accounting for 58.6% of all unemployed. **The long-term unemployment rate** was 3.1% (3.4% for men and 2.6% for women).
- There were 1 291.4 thousand **economically inactive persons aged 15 64,** of whom 552.5 thousand men and 739.0 thousand women. **The inactivity rate (15 64 years)** was 28.5% (24.1% for men and 33.0% for women).
- The number of **discouraged persons aged 15 64** was 81.4 thousand representing 6.3% of the economically inactive population in this age group.
- The proportion of **early leavers from education and training** of population aged 18 24 was 12.7%, the same as in 2017.
- The proportion of **population aged 30 34, having completed tertiary education** was 33.7%, by 0.9 percentage points higher than in 2017.
- The proportion of young people aged 15 29 neither in employment nor in education and training was 18.1% (compared to 18.9% in 2017).





Methodological notes

The Labour Force Survey (LFS) is a continuous sample survey providing quarterly and annual data on the economic activity of the population aged 15 and over. The survey covers non-institutional households.

Reference period - the characteristics of each interviewee refer to his/her status during a defined calendar week.

Economically active population (labour force) comprises of all employed and unemployed persons.

Employed are persons aged 15 and over who during the reference period:

- performed some work for at least one hour for pay in cash or in kind or other income;
- did not work but had a job or an enterprise, a business from which they were temporarily absent due to illness, annual leave, full-paid maternity leave, parental leave, strike or another labour dispute, etc.

Unemployed are persons aged 15 to 74 who:

- did not work at all during the reference period;
- were actively seeking work within the preceding four weeks, including the reference one or have found a new job or business that is expected to start within 3 months following the reference period;
- were available to start work within two weeks following the reference period.

Long-term unemployed are persons who have been unemployed for one or more years.

Economically inactive population (persons not in the labour force) includes persons aged 15 and over who were neither employed, nor unemployed during the reference period.

Discouraged persons are persons not in the labour force who want to work but do not actively look for a job, because they do not believe they will find one.

Activity rate - ratio between the economically active population and the total population of the same age group.

Employment rate - ratio between the employed population and the total population of the same age group.

Unemployment rate - ratio between the unemployed persons and the economically active population.

Long-term unemployment rate - ratio between the long-term unemployed persons and the economically active population.

Inactivity rate - ratio between the economically inactive population and the total population of the same age group.

Early leavers from education and training - persons aged from 18 to 24 having attained lower secondary education as a highest and not received any (formal or non-formal) education or training in the four weeks preceding the survey.





People neither in employment nor in education or training (NEET) are those who were not employed during the reference period (i.e. were unemployed or economically inactive) and in the same time did not receive any (formal or non-formal) education or training in the four weeks preceding the survey.

Average annual data are calculated as average of the four quarters of the respective year.

Because of the rounding of the figures, some of the totals (rows and columns) are not equal to the sum of the components.
