

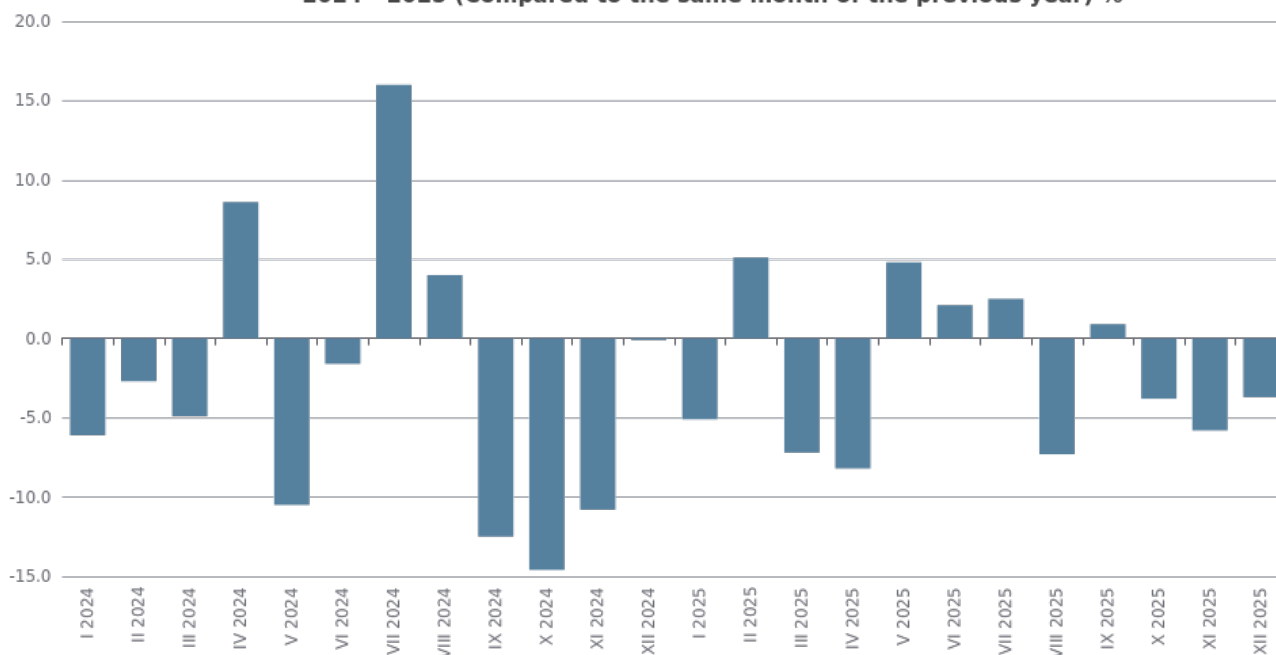


TRADE IN GOODS WITH THIRD COUNTRIES - EXTRASTAT - PRELIMINARY DATA - DECEMBER 2025

In **2025**, the **exports** of goods from Bulgaria to **third countries** decreased by 2.2% in comparison with 2024 and added up to 30 020.0 million BGN (Annex, Tables 1 and 2). The main trade partners of Bulgaria were Türkiye, the United States, Serbia, the Republic of North Macedonia, China, Algeria and the United Kingdom, which accounted for 49.0% of the exports to non-EU countries (Annex, Table 3).

In **December 2025**, the **exports** of goods from Bulgaria to **third countries** decreased by 3.7% compared to the corresponding month of the previous year and amounted to 2 468.2 million BGN.

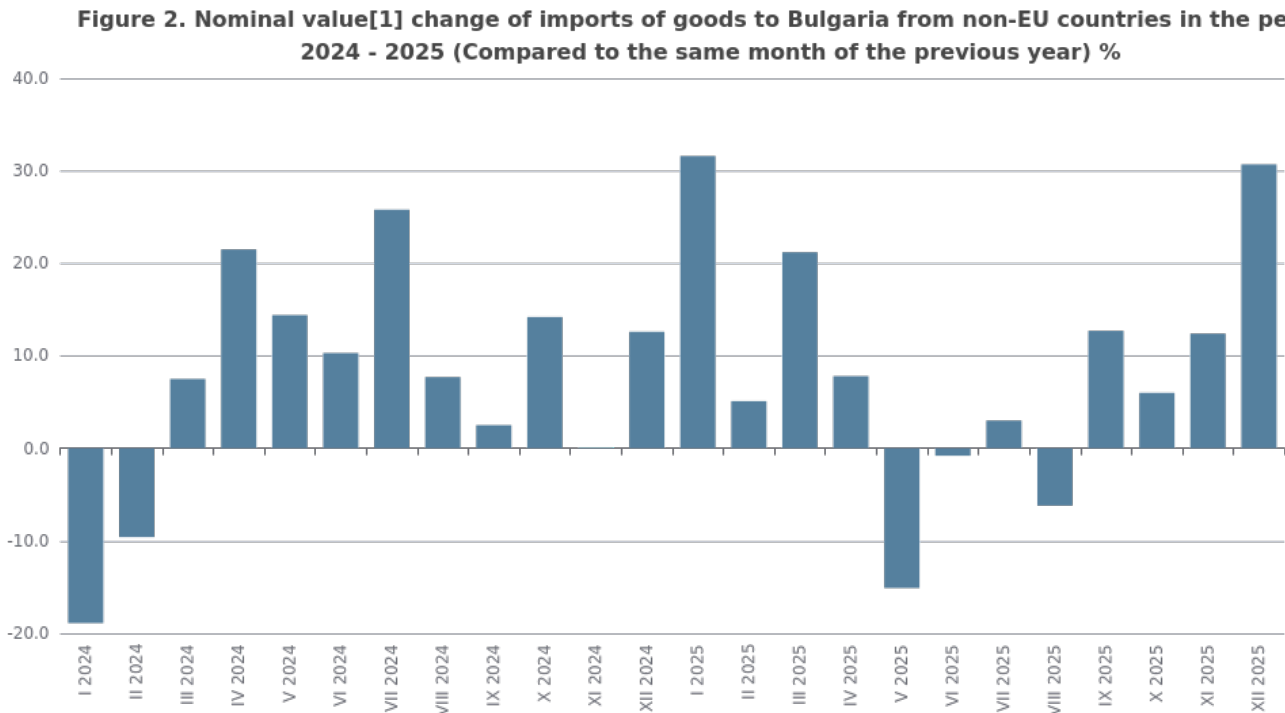
Figure 1. Nominal value[1] change of exports of goods from Bulgaria to non-EU countries in the period 2024 - 2025 (Compared to the same month of the previous year) %



In the **exports of goods** from Bulgaria to third countries, distributed according to the **Standard International Trade Classification**, the most notable growth was recorded in the section 'Miscellaneous manufactured articles' (46.1%) (Annex, Table 4). The most notable fall was reported in the section 'Mineral fuel, lubricants and related materials' (39.5%).

The imports of goods to Bulgaria **from third countries** in **2025** increased by 8.5% in comparison with 2024 and added up to 45 119.5 million BGN (at CIF prices)^[2] (Annex, Tables 1 and 2). The largest amounts were reported for the goods imported from Türkiye, China, Serbia and the United States (Annex, Table 3).

In December 2025, the imports of goods to Bulgaria **from third countries** increased by 30.7% compared to the corresponding month of the previous year and amounted to 4 432.4 million BGN.



In the imports of goods to Bulgaria from third countries, distributed according to the **Standard International Trade Classification**, the largest growth was recorded in the section 'Machinery and transport equipment' (30.6%) (Annex, Table 4). The most notable fall was reported in the section 'Animal and vegetable oils, fats and waxes' (33.0%).

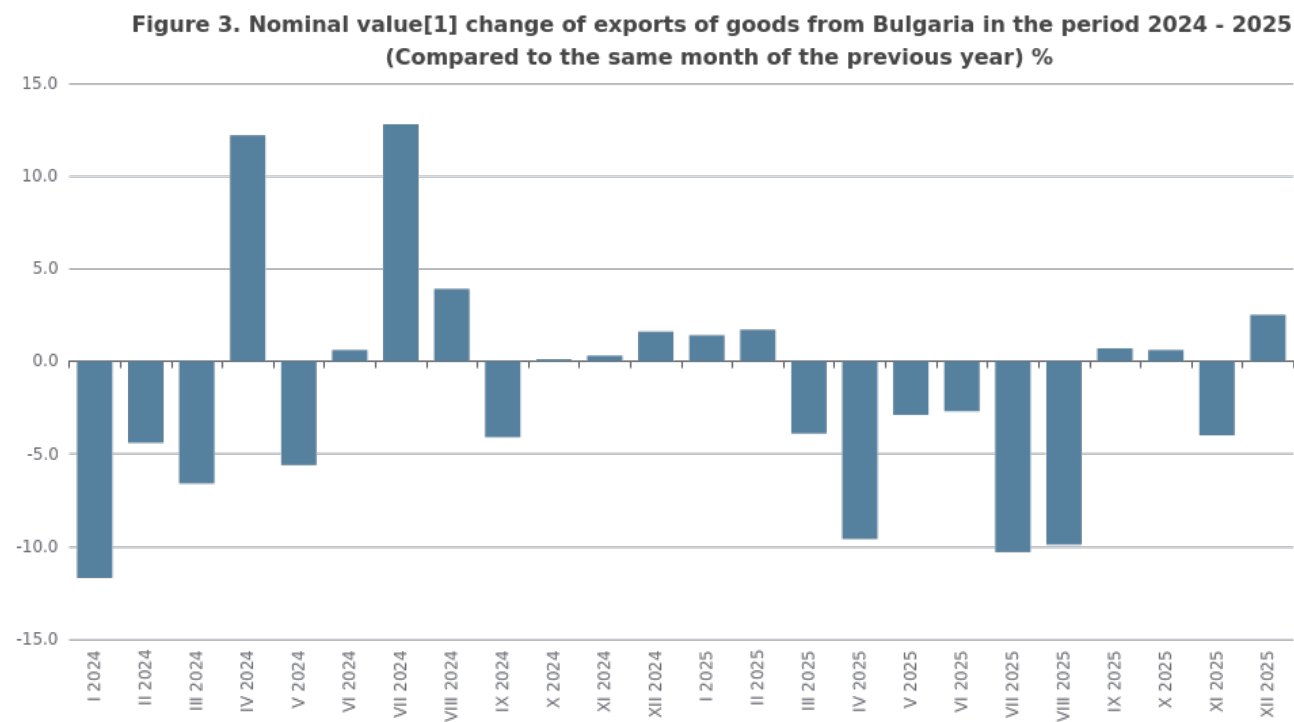
The foreign trade balance of Bulgaria (exports FOB - imports CIF) with third countries in **2025** was negative and added up to 15 099.5 million BGN (Annex, Tables 1 and 3).

In December 2025, the foreign trade balance of Bulgaria (export FOB - import CIF) with third countries was also negative and amounted to 1 964.2 million BGN.

Trade in goods of Bulgaria with third countries and the EU - total

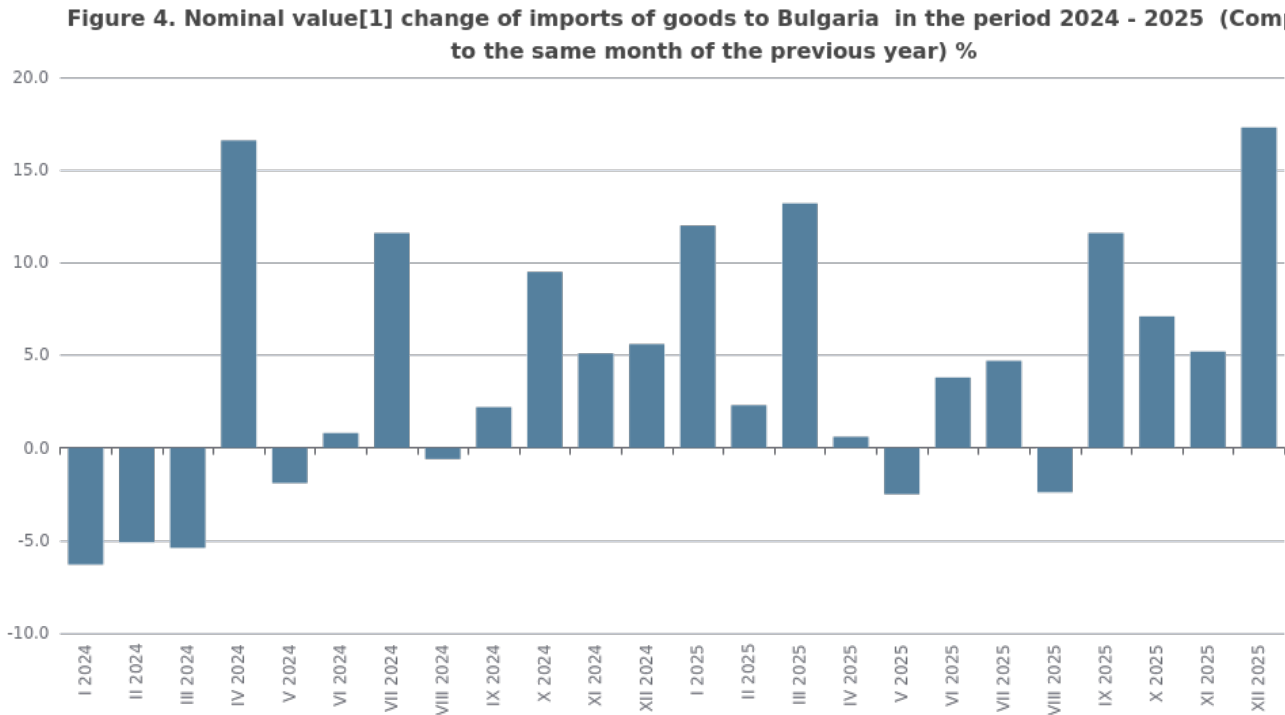
In **2025**, the total value of **all the goods exported** from Bulgaria amounted to 83 894.5 million BGN, which was 3.2% less than the previous year (Annex, Tables 1 and 2).

In December 2025, the total exports of goods added up to 6 736.4 million BGN and increased by 2.5% compared to the corresponding month of the previous year.



The total value of **all the goods imported** into the country in **2025** amounted to 105 605.1 million BGN (at CIF prices), or 6.1% more than 2024 (Annex, Tables 1 and 2).

In December 2025, the total imports of goods increased by 17.3% compared to the same month of the previous year and added up to 9 645.5 million BGN.



The total foreign trade balance (exports FOB - imports CIF) was negative in **2025** and amounted to 21 710.6 million BGN (Annex, Tables 1 and 3).

In December 2025, the total foreign trade balance (exports FOB - import CIF) was also negative and added up to 2 909.1 million BGN.

Methodological Notes

Legislative Framework

Regulation (EU) 2019/2152 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 December 2019 on European business statistics (including intra-EU trade in goods).

Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2020/1197 of 30 September 2020 laying down technical specifications and rules pursuant to Regulation (EU) 2019/2152 of the European Parliament and of the Council on European business statistics.

Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2021/1704 of 14 September 2021 supplementing Regulation (EU) 2019/2152 of the European Parliament and of the Council by further specifying the details of the statistical information to be provided by tax and customs authorities, and amending Annexes V and VI thereof (text relevant to the EEA).

Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2021/1225 of 27 September 2021 laying down the rules for data exchange pursuant to Regulation (EU) 2019/2152 of the European Parliament and of the Council and amending Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2020/1197 regarding the member country of extra-EU export and the obligations of reporting units.

Law on Statistics of Intra-EU Trade in Goods effective from 1 September 2012, amended and supplemented, Issue 61 of 2 December 2022.

Scope and Basic Terminology

External trade in goods covers trade with third countries (Extrastat) and with EU Member States (Intrastat), with detailed statistical information collected at the commodity code level (8 digits) of the Combined Nomenclature.

Imports include all goods entering the statistical territory* of the Republic of Bulgaria from other countries intended for domestic consumption, processing in the country for export after processing, as well as imports of goods processed outside the country.

Exports include all goods leaving the statistical territory of the Republic of Bulgaria intended for normal export to another country. This includes goods returned to the trading partner after processing in Bulgaria or goods exported for processing in another country with the intention of being returned to Bulgaria.

The **statistical territory of the European Union (EU)**, in the context of statistics of international trade in goods, corresponds to the combined customs territories of the EU Member States with one exception: unlike the customs territory, the statistical territory of Germany includes Helgoland.

Statistical volumes of imports and exports do not include imported goods placed under customs warehousing without processing, nor do exports include the re-export of these goods.

International trade statistics do not account for the transit of goods through the territory of the Republic of Bulgaria.

Main Sources of Information

Customs declaration - Single Administrative Document (SAD), which is filled out by all entities importing or exporting goods to/from third countries.

Intrastat declaration for intra-EU imports and exports to/from EU Member States.

The **Customs Agency** is the institution responsible for collecting customs declarations (SAD), and the **National Revenue Agency** is responsible for Intrastat declarations.

Trade estimates are made to compensate for the impact of thresholds below which traders are exempt from submitting Intrastat declarations, as well as for those who have not responded.
