



PRODUCER PRICE INDICES IN INDUSTRY¹

APRIL 2010

1. Producer Price Indices on Domestic Market²

Producer Price Index on Domestic Market in April 2010 rose by 1.9% compared to the previous month. The domestic prices increased in the mining and quarrying industry by 6.3%, in the manufacturing by 2.0% and in the electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply by 0.7%.

In the manufacturing, the more significant prices increases comparing to the previous month were seen in the manufacture of basic metals by 7.3%, in the manufacture of tobacco products by 4.2% and in the manufacture of paper and paper products by 1.9%, while the prices decreased in the manufacture of other non-metallic mineral products by 1.2% and in the manufacture of chemicals and chemical products by 1.1%.


Producer Price Index on Domestic Market in April 2010 rose by 5.6% compared to the same month of 2009. The domestic prices increased in the mining and quarrying industry by 23.9% and in the manufacturing by 9.9% while in the electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply the prices fell by 6.4%.

In the manufacturing compared to the same month of 2009, the prices increase was registered in the manufacture of basic metals by 32.3%, in the manufacture of tobacco products by 25.4%, in the manufacture of other transport equipment by 4.8%. The prices decrease was seen in the manufacture of wood and of products of wood, except furniture by 8.1%, in the manufacture of other non-metallic mineral products by 6.4%, in the manufacture of food products and in the manufacture of fabricated metal products, except machinery and equipment by 2.9%.

¹**Producer Price Indices** measure the average change in the prices of industrial products, which are produced and sold by Bulgarian enterprises. They can be considered as an early measure of the current inflation process in the economy and also they can be used for international comparisons. Information for calculation of Producer Price Indices is received on the bases of monthly surveys on producer prices of industrial products, sold on domestic market and on industrial products sold on non-domestic market. Producer price surveys are based on constant sample of groups of products, and that sample is representative for total industrial production.

² Producer Price Indices on domestic market are calculated at constant base (2005) weighed with turnover structure on domestic market.

2. Total Producer Price Indices in Industry³

Total Producer Price Index in Industry in April 2010 increased by 2.1% compared to the previous month. The higher prices were registered in the mining and quarrying industry by 5.4%, in the manufacturing by 2.3% and in the electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply by 0.9%.

In the manufacturing, more significant prices increase was seen in the manufacture of basic metals by 8.0%, in the manufacture of paper and paper products by 4.5% and in the manufacture of tobacco products by 3.3%.

Total Producer Price Index in April 2010 increased by 8.1% comparing to the same month of 2009.

In the manufacturing, the prices rose by 12.2% as compared to April 2009. More significant prices increases were seen in the manufacture of basic metals by 42.3%, in the manufacture of tobacco products by 20.7% and in the manufacture of paper and paper products by 6.3%, while the producer prices decreased in the manufacture of wood and of products of wood, except furniture by 7.1%, in the manufacture of other non-metallic mineral products by 6.0% and in the manufacture of fabricated metal products, except machinery and equipment by 2.4%.

³ Total Producer Price Index is calculated from Producer Price Index on Domestic Market and Producer Price Index on Non-domestic Market weighted with the turnover structure on domestic and on non-domestic market to the total value of turnover in the base year 2005.

Total Producer Price Indices in Industry (2005 = 100)


