




## TRIPS OF BULGARIAN RESIDENTS ABROAD AND ARRIVALS OF VISITORS FROM ABROAD TO BULGARIA IN SEPTEMBER 2011

In September 2011 the number of the trips of Bulgarian residents abroad was 366.0 thousand, which was 3.2% more than the number of the trips in September 2010 (Table 1). An increase in the total number of the trips was registered namely to: Canada - by 30.3%, Greece - by 23.8%, USA - by 17.8%, Israel - by 16.0%, Slovakia - by 14.6%, Romania - by 11.5%, Spain - by 8.9%, Norway - by 8.8%, Switzerland - by 8.6%, Malta - by 8.4%, Slovenia - by 8.2%, Czech Republic - by 8.1%, Serbia - by 7.4%, etc. At the same time a decrease was observed to: Ireland - by 12.0%, Turkey - by 10.6%, Austria - by 3.4%, FYROM - by 3.0%, and etc.

The highest share of the trips of Bulgarian citizens travelling abroad had those with professional purpose - 37.7%, followed by other purposes (as guest, education, visiting cultural and sport events etc.) - 35.4% and with holiday and recreation - 26.9%.


**Figure 1. Structure of the trips of Bulgarian residents abroad by purpose of visit in September 2011**



In September 2011, the number of arrivals of visitors from abroad to Bulgaria was 1 049.2 thousand or 3.0% more than the number of the trips in the corresponding month of 2010 (Table 2). The largest increase was registered in the number of visitors with passing transit - by 1.5%.



**Figure 2. Number of arrivals of visitors to Bulgaria from abroad by purpose of visit**




In September 2011, the arrivals of visitors from EU Member States rose by 1.7% in comparison with the same month of 2010. The highest growth in the number of visits was observed from Czech Republic and Denmark - by 10.6 and 10.0% respectively. A decrease in the visits was registered from Estonia - by 15.8%, Malta - by 11.7%, Finland - by 9.0%, etc.

The visits of foreigners in the group “Other European countries”<sup>1</sup> were increased by 7.0%. The largest growth in the number of arrivals of citizens was observed from Ukraine - by 24.7% and Russian Federation - by 24.0%, and Serbia - by 11.1%.

In September 2011, the arrivals with holiday and recreation purpose composed the greatest share of the total number of foreigners visited Bulgaria - 49.4%, followed by the visitors passing transit - 27.1%, professional purpose - 12.8% and others - 10.7%.

### **Methodological notes**

Statistical data on the trips of Bulgarian citizens travelling abroad and visits by foreigners in Bulgaria are obtained on the basis of monthly information received from the Ministry of Interior and sample survey of the National Statistical Institute among Bulgarian and foreign citizens passing the border check points.

Data on the number of the trips of the citizens of the European Union are estimated on the basis of the information obtained from the Ministry of Interior and the airport authorities. Data on the number of citizens of “third countries” are obtained directly from the Ministry of Interior.

Data on the purposes of the trips are developed on the basis of the NSI’s regular monthly sample survey of passing Bulgarian and foreign citizens on the border check points.
