


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BULGARIAN TRADE WITH EU IN JANUARY 2012 (PRELIMINARY DATA)


In **January 2012** the Bulgarian **exports** to the **EU** decreased by 7.3% compared to the corresponding month of the previous year and amounted to over 1.7 billion levs (Table 1.1 and 1.2). The main trade partners of Bulgaria were Germany, Italy, Romania, Greece and France that formed 67.8% of the total exports to the EU Member states (Table.2). The most significant growths were observed in the exports to Estonia and Slovenia. The most notable falls were registered in the exports to Luxembourg, Cyprus and Portugal.



Bulgarian **imports from the EU** in January 2012 increased by 1.8% compared to the corresponding month of the previous year and reached 2.0 billion levs at CIF prices (Tables1.1 and 1.2). The most significant growths were reported on the imports from Cyprus, Luxembourg and Netherlands (Table 2). The largest decreases were observed in the imports from Malta, Finland and Denmark.



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The **foreign trade balance** of Bulgaria (export FOB - import CIF) with **EU** in January 2012 was negative and amounted to 276.5 million levs (Table 1.1) At FOB/FOB prices (after elimination of transport and insurance costs on imports) the trade balance was also negative and amounted to 183.0 million levs.

The **exports** of Bulgaria to **EU**, distributed according to the **Standard International Trade Classification**, decreased in most of the sections in January 2012 compared to the corresponding month of the previous year (Table 3). The largest falls were reported in sections "Mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials" and "Crude materials, inedible (except fuels)"¹. The largest growths were recorded in the sections "Animal and vegetable oils, fats and waxes"² and "Beverages and tobacco".

In **imports** from third countries significant fall was reported in section "Animal and vegetable oils, fats and waxes". The largest growth was reported in section "Beverages and tobacco".

¹ The section includes following divisions: raw hides, skins and furskins; oil-seeds and oleaginous fruits; crude rubber; cork and wood; pulp and waste paper; textile fibres and their wastes; crude fertilizers and crude minerals; metalliferous ores and metal scrap; crude animal and vegetable materials, n.e.s.

² The section includes the following divisions: Animal oils and fats ; Fixed vegetable fats and oils, crude, refined or fractionated; Animal or vegetable fats and oils, processed; waxes of animal or vegetable origin; inedible mixtures or preparations of animal or vegetable fats or oils, n.e.s.
