



EMPLOYEES UNDER LABOUR CONTRACT AND AVERAGE WAGES AND SALARIES, THIRD QUARTER OF 2013

According to the preliminary data of the National Statistical Institute (NSI) at the end of September 2013 the **number of employees** under labour contract decreased by 40.8 thousands or 1.8% as compared to the end of June 2013 and reached 2.26 million. The highest decrease was observed in economic activities "Accommodation and food service activities" - 19.7%, "Arts, entertainment and recreation" - 5.6% and "Real estate activities" - 4.6%. Increase of employees was recorded in "Education" - 1.3% and "Wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles and motorcycles" - 0.3%. In the structure of employees by economic activities the biggest relative share of employees was in "Manufacturing" - 21.5% and "Wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles and motorcycles" - 17.1%.

At the end of September 2013 as compared to September 2012 the number of employees under labour contract declined by 20.7 thousands or 0.9%. The highest decrease in absolute figures was observed in economic activities "Manufacturing" - 14.9 thousands and "Construction" - 6.9 thousands. In percentages the highest decrease was in "Other service activities" - 8.1%, "Construction" - 5.0% and "Real estate activities" - by 4.7%.

The **average monthly wages** and salaries of the employees under labour contract in July was 800 BGN, in August - 777 BGN and in September 2013 - 801 BGN.





Figure 1. Average wages and salaries by months





In the third quarter of 2013 in comparison with the second quarter of 2013 the average monthly wages and salaries decreased by 0.9% getting 792 BGN. The highest decrease in wages and salaries was reported in "Other service activities" - 8.3% and "Financial and insurance activities" - 4.6%.

Compared to the third quarter of 2012 the average monthly wages and salaries in the third quarter of 2013 rose by 3.7%. The highest growth rates were recorded in economic activities: "Agriculture, forestry and fishing" - 10.0%, "Education" - 8.8% and "Accommodation and food service activities" - 6.1%.

The economic activities with the highest wages and salaries in the third quarter of 2013 were:

- "Information and communication" 1 860 BGN
- ➤ "Electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply" 1 505 BGN
- ➤ "Financial and insurance activities" 1 456 BGN.

The lowest wages and salaries were recorded in:

- ➤ "Accommodation and food service activities" 539 BGN
- > "Other services activities" 543 BGN
- ➤ "Administrative and support service activities" 556 BGN.

In comparison with a year earlier the average monthly wages and salaries in public sector grew by 5.1%, while in private sector - by 3.3%.




Figure 3. Average monthly wages and salaries





Methodological notes

The source of information is the Quarterly Survey on employees, hours worked, wages and salaries, and other expenditures paid by the employer. It is sample survey which main purpose is to make a study of the current state and dynamics of some main aspects of labour market. The sample used for the survey is a stratified random sample without replacement. Stratification criteria used include: economic activity (NACE rev.2), size of the enterprise (according to the number of employees) and regional breakdown (28 districts, NUTS3).
