





HOUSEHOLDS IN THE REPUBLIC OF BULGARIA AS OF SEPTEMBER 7, 2021

The population and housing census is the only source of exhaustive information on the households in the country.

Household are considered persons living together, no matter relatives or not or living together in a collective under a common regime.

As of September 7, 2021 there are 2 866 657 households in Bulgaria - private and institutional. Nearly three-quarters (74.9 %) of all households live in cities.

Private households are part of all the censuses after the Liberation and can be traced between the censuses.

A household is usually two or more persons who live in the same dwelling or part of a dwelling and have a common budget, regardless of whether they are related to each other or not. A household is also a person who lives in an independent dwelling, room or part of a room and is on an independent budget.

Institutional households as number and persons living in them were observed until 1946. In the next five censuses, only persons in institutional households were counted. In accordance with

the recommendations of the United Nations and the Statistical Office of the European Union, the collection of information on the number of institutional households is again included in the program of the Censuses in 2001. Thus, it is possible to trace the changes that occurred in the number and average size of institutional households between the last three censuses.

An institutional household consists of persons permanently living in a collective, having common budget and respecting a common regime. Members of institutional households are considered persons living in boarding houses, convalescent homes, and homes for medico-social cares for children, social homes, monasteries, and penal institutions, institutions for temporary stay of homeless and other.

1. Private households²

1.1. Number and number of households

From the beginning of the 20th century to today, the number of households in the country has increased 4.3 times, and the population living in them - 1.7 times.

The average size of a household decreased from 5.6 persons in 1900 to 2.2 persons in 2021, and in cities - from 4.4 to 2.2 persons. The decrease in the average number of households Rural was greater - from 6.0 persons in 1900 to 2.4 persons at the last census.

For the period 2011 - 2021, the average number of members in one household decreased in 25 regions, while in the regions of Veliko Tarnovo, Lovech and Pernik it remained unchanged.


A number of demographic and socio-economic factors determines dynamics in the number, size and structure of households. Demographic factors, which refer to changes in the number of the population, birth and death rates, the number of marriages and divorces, the age structure of the population, etc., have a direct impact on the changes in the number and structure of households. After the census in 1985, there were migration processes caused by a number of socio-economic factors. As a result of these processes, changes occur primarily in the structure of households.

That began because of internal migration processes and administrative changes after 1946 affects the share of households living in villages. In 1900, households Rural were 75.4% of households in the country. In the 1956 census, they were 59.5%, and as of 09.07.2021, the share of these households was 25.1%.

Fig. 1. Households by place of residence and census years




Between the last two censuses, the number of households in the country decreased by 139 811 (4.7%), and the persons in them decreased by 851 384 people or by 11.7%. The smaller decrease in the number of households compared to the decrease in the population indicates that the process of increasing one-person and two-person households, at the expense of multi-person households, continues. In 2021, nearly two-thirds (65.2%) of households in Bulgaria are one-person and two-person households.

The number of single-person households increased from 925 385 in 2011 to 1 026 198 in 2021, and their relative share of all households increased over the same period by 5.0 percentage points (from 30.8% to 35.8%). For the same period, two-member households decreased by 11 121 and as of 09.07.2021 were 842 614. Their relative share increased by 1.0 percentage points.

During the period 2011 - 2021, three-member households decreased by 97 753 and as of 09.07.2021 their number amounted to 508 860. They make up 17.8% of all households in the country.

An absolute and relative decrease is also found in households with four or more people. Between the last two censuses, their number decreased from 619 856 to 488 036 households, and their relative share decreased by 3.6 percentage points.

Fig. 2. Structure of households by number of members for 2011 and 2021




There are also changes in the number and size of households by region. They are due to the specific features of individual areas, primarily related to: the intensity of demographic processes - birth and death rates, the size and direction of migration flows - internal and external, as well as their different economic development.

During the period 2011 - 2021, the number of households decreased in 25 districts, with the most sensitive decrease in the districts of Veliko Tarnovo - with 21 088 households, Pleven - with 11 951 households, and Vratsa - with 11 804 households. In 3 districts, the number of households is increasing. In these areas, the increase is respectively: in Sofia (the capital) - by 41 882, in Kardzhali - by 3 164, and in Plovdiv - by 2 841 households.

The relative share of single-member households is the largest in the regions of Sofia (the capital) - 42.6%, Montana - 37.3%, Varna and Ruse - 36.9% each. The share of these households is the smallest in the districts of Blagoevgrad - 28.7%, and Kardzhali - 29.7%.

At the latest census, the regions with the largest relative share of households with four or more members are Blagoevgrad (24.3%), Kardzhali and Pazardzhik (respectively 21.5%) and Razgrad (20.9%).

1.2. Households with children under 16 years of age

The trend of increasing the relative share of households without children under the age of 16 continues. As of September 7, 2021, 2 235 322 (78.0%) of households in the country are without children under 16 years of age.

In the ten-year period between the last two censuses, the number of these households decreased by 66 943.

There are 630 386 households with children under the age of 16, a decrease of 72 938 compared to 2011. In 62.3% of these households, there is only one child in this age group.

The specific features of the individual areas also determine the differences between them according to the indicator "number of children under 16 in the household". Over 80% of households in Vidin, Gabrovo, Montana and Smolyan regions have no children under 16 years of age. The share of these households is the smallest in the districts of Blagoevgrad - 74.5%, Sliven - 75.4%, and Burgas - 75.9%.


1.3. Main characteristics of the head of household

As of September 7, 2021, in 54.7% of households in the country, the head of the household is under the age of 60. Compared to the previous census, this relative share has decreased by 5.7 percentage points.

At the regional level, Sofia (the capital) and Varna stand out, where households with heads under the age of 60 are respectively 65.2% and 60.0% of the households in the region.

The average age of the head of the household increased between the last two censuses from 53.6 years in 2011 to 56.0 years old in 2021. This also affects the economic status of the heads of households.

As of September 7, 2021, 51.8% of all households are headed by economically active persons (47.8% - employed, and 4.0% - unemployed). The heads of 48.2% of households in the country are economically inactive.

There is a significant difference in the regions according to the economic status of the head of the household. The share of households in which the head of the household is a working person is the highest in the districts of Sofia (the capital) and Varna - respectively 62.9% and 52.7%. In 23 of the districts, in more than half of the households, the head of the household is an economically inactive person. Their share is the largest in the regions of Kardzhali - 62.2%, Vidin - 60.5%, and Kyustendil - 60.1%.



The distribution of households by ethnic groups was made depending on the answer given by the head of the household. In 2 303 263 households (87.6%), the head of the household self-identifies as belonging to the Bulgarian ethnic group, in 189 631 households (7.2%) to the Turkish ethnic group, and in 75 484 households (2.9%) to the Roma ethnic group. In 27 963 (1.1%) households, the head of the household is unwilling or unable to identify his ethnicity.


Households in which the head of the household is of the Bulgarian ethnicity mostly consist of one or two persons. Almost half (49.2%) of the households headed by the Roma ethnic group are multi-member - with four or more persons.

Pernik (96.9%) and Sofia (capital) (96.1%) regions have the largest relative share of households in which the head of the household is self-identified as Bulgarian, and Kardzhali region (30.3%) has the smallest. In this area, the largest relative share - 62.5% - is the households headed by the Turkish ethnic group.

2. Institutional households

As of September 7, 2021, 949 institutional households were counted in Bulgaria, in which 25 866 people live, or 0.4% of the country's population. Their average size is 27.3 persons. 63.1% of all institutional households are located in cities. 69.3% of people live in them.

During the period 2011 - 2021, the number of institutional households in the country increased by 20.6%, which is mainly due to the restructuring of part of the institutional households. Institutional households increased by 90 Urban, and by 72 Rural.

Those living in institutional households decreased by 5 530 persons between the last two censuses. In cities, persons living in institutional households decreased by 4,423, and in villages - by 1 107 persons.

The average number of members in institutional households varies by household type. With the largest average number (37.0 persons) are homes for the elderly. Religious institutional households have the smallest average number of members (2.9). The main part of these households are monasteries.

Between the last two censuses, there have been significant changes in the different types of institutional households. The relative share of educational households in 2011 was 18.4% of all institutional households and decreased to 3.6% in 2021. During this period, the number of health institutional households also decreased by 42.3%. The number of other types of institutional households is increasing.

METHODOLOGICAL NOTES

Private household

Household is:

- one person who lives independently in dwelling, room or part from room and is on independent budget;
- two or more persons who live in house or part of house and they have common budget, regardless whether they are related or not.

"Common budget" means that persons living together have common expenditure, i.e. take meals together and share the expenditure on bringing up children or other persons without income. It is not obligatory the resources of all household members to be spent together in order to consider that persons are sharing a common budget.

Persons who do not share a common budget and do not take meals together are not considered a household, no matter living together and even inhabit one and the same room.

Persons permanently living in students or workers hostels also constitute a private household (one-person or multi-person household).

Household head is considered the person providing the main means for living or the person recognized by the household as such. The household head should usually live in the dwelling.

Institutional household

An institutional household consists of persons permanently living in an institutional, having common budget and respecting a common regime. Members of institutional households are considered persons living in boarding-houses, convalescent homes, homes for medico-social cares for children, social homes for bringing up children without parents, homes for elderly, establishments for disabled, psychiatric and pulmonary institutions, monasteries, penal institutions, institutions for temporary stay of homeless and other. Boarding schools are also included.

Types of institutional households:

- Educational homes for bringing up children without parents, boarding houses, convalescent homes, religious schools, boarding schools and others;
- Health homes for medico-social cares for children, establishments for disabled, psychiatric, and pulmonary hospitals and dispensaries;
- Homes for elderly homes for retired persons or elderly without families;
- Religious monasteries and other religious institutional households;
- Other penal institutions, pedagogic boarding houses, institutions for temporary stay of homeless, protected dwellings and other not classified above.
