




## EMPLOYEES UNDER LABOUR CONTRACT AND GROSS AVERAGE WAGES AND SALARIES, SECOND QUARTER OF 2018

According to the preliminary data of the National Statistical Institute (NSI) at the end of June 2018 the **number of employees** under labour contract increased by 42.6 thousand or 1.8% as compared to the end of March 2018 and reached 2.35 million. The highest increase was observed in seasonal economic activities: 'Accommodation and food service activities' - 30.7% and 'Agriculture, forestry and fishing' - 7.9% and also in 'Construction' - by 3.7%. The highest decrease of the number of employees was recorded in 'Education' - by 2.7%.

In the structure of employees by economic activities the biggest relative share of employees was in 'Manufacturing' - 21.8% and 'Wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles and motorcycles' - 16.9%.

At the end of June 2018 as compared to June 2017 the number of employees under labour contract increased by 13.7 thousand or 0.6%. The highest increase in absolute figures was observed in economic activities 'Construction' - 6.4 thousand, 'Wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles and motorcycles' - 3.6 thousand, and 'Transportation and storage' - 3.4 thousand and the highest decrease - in 'Accommodation and food service activities' - 7.6 thousand. In percentages the highest increase at the end of June 2018 as compared to June 2017 was in economic activity 'Construction' - by 5.4% and 'Information and communication' - by 3.9%, as the highest decrease was reported in 'Arts, entertainment and recreation' - by 6.6%.

The **average monthly wages and salaries** of the employees under labour contract in April was 1 145 BGN, in May - 1 110 BGN and in June 2018 - 1 119 BGN.








In the second quarter of 2018 in comparison with the first quarter of 2018 the average monthly wages and salaries increased by 4.5% getting 1 125 BGN. The highest increase in wages and salaries was reported in 'Agriculture, forestry and fishing' - by 9.8%, 'Construction' - by 8.2% and 'Financial and insurance activities' - by 6.7%.

Compared to the second quarter of 2017 the average monthly wages and salaries in the second quarter of 2018 rose by 8.2%. The highest growth rates were recorded in economic activities: 'Information and communication' - 15.5%, 'Education' - 12.3% and 'Construction' - 11.4%.

The economic activities with the highest wages and salaries in the second quarter of 2018 were:


- 'Information and communication' 2 663 BGN
- 'Financial and insurance activities' 1 922 BGN
- 'Electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply' 1 821 BGN.

The lowest wages and salaries were recorded in:

- 'Accommodation and food service activities' 697 BGN
- 'Other service activities' 788 BGN
- 'Construction' 887 BGN.

In comparison with a year earlier the average monthly wages and salaries in public sector grew by 9.6% while in private sector - by 7.6%.

## **Methodological notes**

The source of information is the Quarterly Survey on employees, hours worked, wages and salaries, and other expenditures paid by the employer. It is sample survey which main purpose is to make a study of the current state and dynamics of some main aspects of labour market. The sample used for the survey is a stratified random sample without replacement. Stratification criteria used include: economic activity (NACE rev. 2), size of the enterprise (according to the number of employees) and regional breakdown (28 districts, NUTS3).
