

#### INFLATION AND CONSUMER PRICE INDICES IN SEPTEMBER 2022

The monthly inflation rate was 1.2%, while the annual inflation rate was 18.7%. The inflation rate is measured by the CPI, with monthly inflation referring to the month of September 2022 compared to the previous month, and annual inflation being for September 2022 compared to the same month of the previous year.

In September 2022, compared to the previous month, the highest price increase was registered for Education (+5.4%), Housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels (+4.2%) and Food and non-alcoholic beverages (+2.3%). The decrease was recorded in the prices for Recreation and culture (-4.6%), Transport (-2.9%) and Communications (-1.8%).

#### **Consumer price index (CPI)**

In September 2022, the **monthly inflation** rate was 1.2% compared to the previous month, and the **annual inflation** rate in September 2022 compared to September 2021 was 18.7%. <sup>1</sup>

The inflation rate since the beginning of the year (September 2022 compared to December 2021) was 14.0%, and the annual average inflation rate for the period October 2021 - September 2022 compared to the period October 2020 - September 2021 was 12.8%.




Figure 1. Inflation, measured by CPI, by month

In September 2022, compared to the previous month, the prices of goods and services increased in the following consumer groups:

- Education an increase of 5.4%;
- Housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels an increase of 4.2%;

- Food and non-alcoholic beverages an increase of 2.3%;
- Clothing and footwear an increase of 1.9%;
- Health an increase of 0.9%;
- Furnishings, household equipment and routine maintenance of the house an increase of 0.8%;
- Miscellaneous goods and services an increase of 0.8%;
- Alcoholic beverages and tobacco an increase of 0.4%;
- Restaurants and hotels an increase of 0.3%.

In September 2022, compared to the previous month, the prices of goods and services decreased in the following consumer groups:

- Recreation and culture a decrease of 4.6%;
- Transport a decrease of 2.9%;
- Communications a decrease of 1.8%.

## Harmonized index of consumer prices (HICP)

According to the HICP, in September 2022 the **monthly inflation** rate was 0.7% compared to the previous month, and the **annual inflation** rate in September 2022 compared to September 2021 was 15.6%.<sup>1</sup>

The inflation rate since the beginning of the year (September 2022 compared to December 2021) was 12.0%, and the annual average inflation rate for the period October 2021 - September 2022 compared to the period October 2020 - September 2021 was 10.9%.




Figure 2. Inflation, measured by HICP, by month

In terms of HICP, in September 2022, compared to the previous month, the prices of goods and services increased in the following consumer groups:

- Education an increase of 4.9%;
- Housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels an increase of 4.0%;
- Clothing and footwear an increase of 2.1%;
- Food and non-alcoholic beverages an increase of 2.0%;
- Health an increase of 0.9%;
- Miscellaneous goods and services an increase of 0.9%;
- Furnishings, household equipment and routine maintenance of the house an increase of 0.8%;
- Alcoholic beverages and tobacco an increase of 0.4%.

In September 2022, compared to the previous month, the prices of goods and services decreased in the following consumer groups:

- Transport a decrease of 2.4%;
- Communications a decrease of 1.8%;
- Restaurants and hotels a decrease of 1.8%:
- Recreation and culture a decrease of 0.6%.

#### Price index of a small basket (PISB)

According to the **price index of a small basket,** in September 2022 a price increase of 2.9% was registered on a monthly basis and a price increase of 17.4% since the beginning of the year (September 2022 compared to December 2021).<sup>1</sup>

In September 2022, compared to the previous month, the prices of goods and services in the small basket for the 20% of households with the lowest income changed as follows:

- Non-food products an increase of 4.7%;
- Food products an increase of 3.0%;
- Services an increase of 0.3%.

### Methodological notes

The **consumer price index (CPI)** is the official measure of inflation in the Republic of Bulgaria. It measures the total relative price change of goods and services used by households for private (non-production) consumption. It is calculated by applying the structure of Bulgarian households' final monetary consumption expenditures. The main source of information for the expenditures is the household budget survey in the country. The CPI in year *t* is calculated with the expenditures' structure of year *t-1*.

The Harmonized Index of Consumer Prices (HICP) is the comparable measure of inflation across EU Member States. It is one of the criterions of price stability and the readiness of Bulgaria to join the Eurozone. HICP, as well as CPI, measures the total relative price change of goods and services. Both indices are calculated using the same basket of goods and services but differ with concern to the weights used. HICP is calculated using weights, which reflect the individual and collective consumption of all households (incl. institutional and foreign households) in the country's economic territory. The main source of information for HICP weights is the national accounts (NA) data. For calculating the HICP in 2022, NA data for households' final monetary consumption expenditures (HFMCE) - domestic concept in 2020 is used. NA 2020 data are reviewed and updated to make them representative of 2021, following Eurostat's methodological guidance on the compilation of HICP weights in case of large changes in consumer expenditures<sup>1</sup>.

In compliance with Regulation (EC) No. 2015/2010 since January 2016, the base year for the HICP has changed, and all indices have been calculated and published using 2015 as a base year. The time series have been recalculated according to the new base year and have been posted on the NSI website (www.nsi.bg).

The **Price Index of a Small Basket (PISB)** measures the relative average price changes of 100 socially useful and vital living goods and services. The weights of this index reflect the expenditures of the 20% lowest households' incomes. The source for weights information is the Households Budget Survey in the country. This index in year *t* is calculated with the weights of year *t-1*.

The **chain** consumer price indices measure the price change in the current month compared to the previous month. The chain consumer price indices are used as a measure of **monthly inflation**.

The **12-month** consumer price indices measure the price changes occurring between the current month and the same month of the previous year. The 12-month consumer price indices are used as a measure of **annual inflation.**

Consumer price indices **over December of the previous year** measure the accumulated changes in prices of the current month concerning December of the previous year. Consumer price indices over December of the previous year are used as measures of **inflation since the beginning of the year.** In December of each year, the 12-months index is equal to the index over December of the previous year.

The **annual average** consumer price indices measure the average price change during the 12 months of the current year compared to the average price change during the 12 months of the previous year. The annual average consumer price indices are used as a measure of the **annual average inflation.**
