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INVESTMENT ACTIVITY IN INDUSTRY¹ MARCH 2020

In March 2020, National statistical institute carried out the regular business survey of investment activity² among industrial enterprises, which provides information about both the investments made by them in 2019 and their investment plans in this year.

According to the survey data, in 2019 the expenditures for acquiring fixed tangible and intangible assets in industry are preserved compared to 2018.

However, the inquiry results of the investment activity show that the plans of industrial enterprises in 2020 are for a decrease of investments by 21.8% in comparison with the previous year. The share of the private sector in the total volume of the expected expenditures for acquiring fixed tangible and intangible assets in this year is 86.2%, as the managers in this sector foresee a decrease of their investments programs by 25.3% compared to 2019.

According to the main industrial groupings³ (Figure 1) the industries producing intermediate goods form the greatest share of expected investments in 2020 (37.0%) with an expected decrease of 30.3% in comparison with the previous year. In the second place in foreseen volume of investments are the energy and water-related industries (with a relative share of 31.8%) which expect an increase of 13.6% compared to 2019. The industries producing non-durable goods are next with relative share of 17.1% as the managers' expectations are for a decrease of the investment programs by 30.6% compared to the previous year.
