



LABOUR FORCE SURVEY SECOND QUARTER OF 2012 (PRELIMINARY DATA)

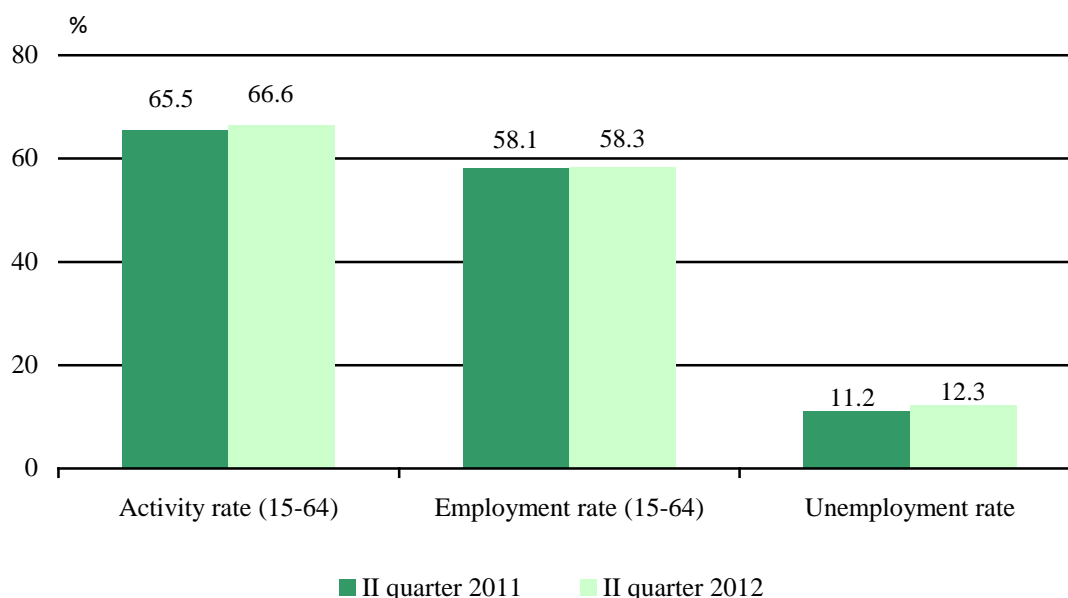
According to the preliminary results from the Labour Force Survey, carried out by the National Statistical Institute in the second quarter of 2012 **the economically active population aged 15-64** was 3 283.1 thousand, representing 66.6% of the population in the same age group. In comparison with the second quarter of 2011 the activity rate was by 1.1 percentage points higher.

The total number of employed persons was 2 913.5 thousand and their proportion of population aged 15 and over was 46.2%.

The number of employed persons aged 15-64 was 2 875.1 thousand. **The employment rate for the population** of the same age group was 58.3%, by 0.2 percentage points higher than in the same quarter of 2011.

The number of **unemployed persons** was 409.7 thousand and the **unemployment rate** - 12.3%. In comparison with the second quarter of 2011 the unemployment rate increased by 1.1 percentage points.

Methodological notes

The Labour Force Survey (LFS) is a continuous sample survey providing quarterly and annual data on the economic activity of the population aged 15 and over. The survey covers non-institutional households.

Reference period - the characteristics of each interviewee refer to his/her status during a defined calendar week.

Economically active population (labour force) comprises all employed and unemployed persons.

Employed are persons aged 15 and over who during the reference period:

- performed some work for at least one hour for pay in cash or in kind or other income;
- did not work but had a job or an enterprise, a business from which they were temporarily absent due to illness, annual leave, full-paid maternity leave, parental leave, strike or another labour dispute, etc.

Unemployed are persons aged 15 to 74 who:

- did not work at all during the reference period;
- were actively seeking work within the preceding four weeks, including the reference one or have found a new job or business that is expected to start within 3 months following the reference period;
- were available to start working within two weeks following the reference period.

Inactive population (persons not in the labour force) includes persons aged 15 and over who were neither employed, nor unemployed during the reference period.

Activity rate - ratio between the economically active population and the total population of the same age group.

Employment rate - ratio between the employed population and the total population of the same age group.

Unemployment rate - ratio between the unemployed persons and the economically active population.

For the weighting of the results of the survey the current population estimates as of 31 March 2012 for the population living in non-institutional households were used. Since the beginning of 2012 a new weighting procedure has been implemented and the results from the survey were adjusted to the population of the country by sex, urban/rural areas and five-year age groups. With the view to ensure comparability the same method was used for reweighting and adjustment of the results for the respective quarter of 2011 (shown in Table 1), using 2011 Population Census data.
