By preliminary seasonally adjusted data ${ }^{3}$ in October 2013 the turnover in Retail trade, except of motor vehicles and motorcycles at constant prices increased by $0.6 \%$ compared to the previous month.
In October 2013 the working day adjusted ${ }^{4}$ turnover in Retail trade, except of motor vehicles and motorcycles grew by $6.9 \%$ in comparison with the same month of the previous year.

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## Monthly changes

In October compared to the previous month the turnover increased in the 'Retail sale via mail order houses or via Internet' by $21.6 \%$, in the 'Retail sale of computers, peripheral units and software; telecommunications equipment' by $3.0 \%$, in the 'Dispensing chemist; retail sale of medical and orthopaedic goods, cosmetic and toilet articles' by $2.7 \%$, in the 'Retail sale of textiles, clothing, footwear and leather goods' and in the 'Retail sale of audio and video equipment; hardware, paints and glass; electrical household appliances' by $1.7 \%$ and in the 'Other retail sale in non-specialised stores' by $0.3 \%$. A decrease was registered in the 'Retail sale of automotive fuel' by $1.3 \%$ and in the 'Retail sale of food, beverages and tobacco' by $0.9 \%$.

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## Annual changes

In October 2013 compared to the same month of 2012 the turnover increased in all economic activities. More significant growth was observed in the 'Retail sale of textiles, clothing, footwear and leather goods' by $26.6 \%$, in the 'Retail sale via mail order houses or via Internet' by $25.0 \%$, in the 'Retail sale of audio and video equipment; hardware, paints and glass; electrical household appliances' by $10.7 \%$, in the 'Other retail sale in non-specialised stores’ by $9.8 \%$, in the 'Retail sale of computers, peripheral units and software; telecommunications equipment' by $9.2 \%$ and in the 'Dispensing chemist; retail sale of medical and orthopaedic goods, cosmetic and toilet articles' by $8.8 \%$.

The monthly turnover indices are calculated with 2010 as a base year.

    ${ }^{4}$ Working day adjustment is an adjustment for variations caused by calendar effects, different number of calendar and working days in the months, national holydays and outliers (for example the presence of more non-working days in May could contribute to the decline in the retail trade).
