

The implementation of the National Classification of Economic Activities in statistics leads up to some essential differences in comparison with the accepted terms and branches. The most substantial differences are as follows:

1. In NCEA the industrial activities differ significantly from that of CBNE '86:
  - CBNE '86 industrial activities are included in 44 NCEA divisions, while 33 of them are industrial divisions in NCEA, based on NACE Rev.1. Logging and repairing of motor vehicles, motorcycles and personal and household goods are not industrial activities according to NCEA.
  - Logging in NCEA is an activity group in division 'Forestry, logging and related service activities'. In CBNE '86 logging is a branch in 'Logging and wood-processing industry'.
  - The repair of motor vehicles, motorcycles and personal and household goods forms together with trade activities one section. In CBNE '86 all repairing activities are included in 'Industry'.
  - Industrial activities in NCEA include: Mining and quarrying, Manufacturing and Manufacturing of electricity, gas and water supply.
2. 'Industry' as a term in SNA includes industrial activities (Mining and quarrying, Manufacturing and Manufacturing of electricity, gas and water supply) and Construction.
3. In NCEA division 'Construction' there are included only real construction works, as compared to CBNE '86 - Construction, in which there are also architectural and engineering activities (a part of business services in NCEA).
4. Agriculture and related service activities include Growing of crops; market gardening; horticulture; Farming of animals and Maintenance and operation of green areas (in CBNE '86 the last group is included in business activities). As a separate division in NCEA is given Hunting, trapping and game propagation, including related service activities.
5. Forestry division in NCEA includes also logging and the activities of gathering of wild growing forest products. It does not include hunting.
6. The difference between CBNE '86 and NCEA for transport sections is mainly in the travel agency activities and maintenance and operation of streets, which in CBNE '86 are given respectively together with health and social works and urban activities.
7. According to NACE Rev. 1, in one section there are trade activities and repair of motor vehicles, motorcycles, personal and household goods are included in. As a difference to CBNE '86, the restaurant activities are not defined as 'trade' activity and are classified together with the hotel activities.
8. The economic activity structure by CBNE '86 and NCEA in the field of services are comparable only through an additional processing of the statistical data by NCEA-classes using the corresponding tables. More essential are the differences in Financial intermediation, Real estate, renting and business activities now being created in the national economy.
